Strong Core Instruction Program	Literacy: By June 2023, all K-5 students who were assessed using independent running records as of October 2022, will make at least one year of growth or be on grade level according to their independent reading level. Math: By the end of the 2022-2023 school year 20% of our K-5 students who were able to be assessed at BOY will score proficient or advanced on the grade level end of year assessment in the Spring of 2022.
Wrap-Around Supports and Opportunities	Increase availability and opportunity for students and families to access services that support academics, health, and wellness. These services are available before, during, and after school and are provided year round to the full community. These needs will be identified from the family surveys. 1. Reduce the barriers to transportation by providing ways for students to get to school on time. 2. Increase the number of students accessing the After School Program to allow students to access the full day of opportunities. 3. Increase the opportunities and access for health service for families and scholars to decrease the amount of time spent out of school 4. Increase the amount of programming opportunities for scholars and families, as identified by survey to support school day attendance. 5. Increase the number of books scholars have at their home libraries Students will have access to high-quality afterschool and day programs.
Positive Discipline Practices	Continue to build and grow capacity around culturally authentic and responsive practices, during the 22-23 school year we will focus on cultural and linguistically responsive coaching and do a focus on the 5 main restorative practices. Students will be able to demonstrate knowledge of restorative practices.
Authentic Family and Community Engagement	By the end of 2022-23 school year, Increase parent involvement and engagement in event planning and participation. This will be through school events and extended learning

	 Professional development that is identified from data. We will use our CLT's to review data and select staff practices that will have the highest impact on student success. The staff will be focusing on conferring and small-group instruction. Our grades K-2 will be focusing on phonics and early literacy. The staff will continue to build their cultural competence to best serve our scholars and families. We will provide support and learning and collaborative connections with our parents.

	Evidence-based teaching - We chose to have two coaches to improve universal literacy instruction. We will utilize the Lucy Calkins curriculum for teaching reading and writing and <i>Bridges in Mathematics</i> to support the curriculum.
